

Church Schools Entry - Scholastic Year 2021-2022 Regulations for Asylum Seekers

*These Regulations form part of the Regulations for Admission into Church Schools
Malta*

Admissions Criteria

1. The Regulations for Admission of children into Church Schools in Malta in scholastic year 2021-2022 provide a number of places for Asylum seekers – children who themselves or their parents sought asylum when they came to Malta.
2. Church Schools Entry is linked to the year of birth. For every year of entry, applicants have to be born in the year indicated hereunder:
 - for entry in Kindergarten 1, applicants have to be born in the year 2018;
 - for entry in Kindergarten 2, applicants have to be born in the year 2017;
 - for entry in Year 1 Primary, applicants have to be born in 2016;
 - for entry in Year 4 Primary, applicants have to be born in 2013;
 - for entry in Form 1 Secondary, applicants have to be born in the year 2010.

2.1 The Church Schools Admissions Board will consider requests for age exemption from applicants on presentation of the specific case/s.

2.2 Children who have the assistance of an L.S.E. or similar, or have started or are about to start the statementing process at the Statementing Moderating Panel or at the C.D.A.U., or have or will have certification from an educational psychologist or similar, which can lead to the assistance of an L.S.E. or similar, must apply as a Serious Case “Other Applicants” or as the case may be according to the Serious Cases Regulations.

As per Circular dated 23rd January 2021, places for students with L.S.E. support are available for Kinder 1 Boys and Girls, Kinder 2 Boys and Girls, Year 1 Primary Boys and Girls, Year 4 Primary Girls and Form 1 Secondary Girls.

Places for Serious Cases with the support of an L.S.E. for Form 1 Secondary Boys have been filled by Criteria 1 applicants. Regrettably, serious cases “Other Applicants” may only apply in cases of revision of statement for the termination of LSE support and for social cases.

4. RELIGION:

- 4.1 The aim of Church Schools is to impart a civic and Christian education to children according to the ideals of the Catholic Church as expressed in the Church Documents on Christian Education. Church Schools offer the teaching of the Catholic Religion, which includes Catholic Ethics. Church Schools will not offer an alternative subject to the teaching of the Catholic Religion.
- 4.2 St. Dominic Savio and St. Paul's Missionary College only accept candidates who present a Baptism Certificate of the Catholic Church or a Certificate stating acceptance in the Catholic Church.
- 4.3 St. Augustine College, Archbishop's Seminary, Our Lady Immaculate Hamrun, St Dorothy Żebbuġ and Sliema, St. Monica B'Kara, Gżira and Mosta, Sacred Heart College and St Angela Lija, Msida, Rabat and Zabbar accept applicants who present a Baptism certificate of the Catholic or a Christian Church.
- 4.4 The other schools accept Catholics, Christians and Others.

5. Documentation Required:

- 1 photo of the applicant.
- Any medical certificates of the applicant if applicable.
- The Educational Programme Declaration, filled by the Head of School, indicating whether the student is mainstream, has access arrangements or is supported by an LSE. This Declaration may be downloaded from www.church.mt

Not applicable if applying for Kinder 1.

In certain circumstances the Educational Programme Declaration may be sent later. In this case the applicant needs to indicate whether the student is mainstream, has access arrangements or is supported by an LSE. If there is a discrepancy between the parents' declaration and that of the Head of School, the Admissions Board will consider the indications by the Head of School and chances available according to the parents' indication may be forfeited even if they have already occurred.

The Educational Programme Declaration signed by the Head of School needs to be sent to Admissions Office not later than two days before the School Registration, for the application to be valid. If this is not submitted, then the application will be incomplete and hence invalid.

- Latest identification documents for child and parent/parents.
 - Birth certificate of applicant, either Maltese or foreign - optional.

- 6.1 Application forms for asylum seekers will also be filled by personnel in charge at the Jesuit Refugee Service, St Aloysius' Sports Complex, 50 Triq ix-Xorrox, Birkirkara, Phone: 2144 2751 from Monday 15th March to Thursday 15th April 2021, between 9:00 and 12:00. - 6.2** Parents/ guardians who submit an application online for Asylum Seekers, are to contact Admissions Office on cynthia.cassar@maltadiocese.org , should they not receive an acknowledgement by Monday, 31 May 2021.
- 7.** On the application form, parents are to indicate their school preference/s. This/these preference/s is/are only taken into account if and when the applicant is being registered in a school. The preference indicated by parents is purely indicative and binds neither the Secretariat for Catholic Education, nor the particular school indicated.
- 8.** The applications and requests of asylum seekers are presented to the Church Schools Admissions Board. The Board will study all the applications and will decide which applicants will be registered in which Church School, taking into account all the circumstances presented in the application form. Decisions of the Church Schools Admissions Board are final.
- 9.** Applicants who will be registered in a Church School will be informed by the Church Schools Admissions Board by email provided on application form.
- 10.** Applications may still be accepted by not later than the end of July 2021 if places have not yet been filled by the School. These will be accepted at The Secretariat for Catholic Education, Admissions Office , Floriana, Phone: 25906306/9.

Other Matters

- 11.** All information provided to the Church Schools Admissions Board in relation to oneself or ones child which according to the Data Protection Act 2018 is "Personal Data" will only be processed in accordance with the said Act.
